



## **Building the Education Revolution with Pureheat's Highmount**

With the Federal Government's Economic Stimulus Package ([BER](#)) for education well underway, the [Pureheat Highmount](#) fan-assisted electric heater range has been chosen by numerous schools as their heating method of choice.

The Highmount series has been specifically chosen for these situations because they meet so many of the exacting demands in school applications. The Highmount is designed for wall mounting between 1800mm and 2500mm above the floor. They incorporate a pre-set two stage thermostat which cuts from a boost element to an economy element once the room achieves the set temperature, generally around 22°C, to maximise energy savings.

The Pureheat Highmount was chosen above any other heater to be put in these schools because they are available in five different wattages from 1.6kw to 4.5kw, which allows just the right amount of heat for the size of the room. All heaters come with an easy to replace safety thermal fuse and 12 month service warranty.

When choosing a heater that would be safe and energy efficient, the schools chose the Highmount because operator control can be limited with the use of the [HM7B Timer / Pre Set Thermostat controller](#), which features both a three hour-to-off timer and an overriding pre-set thermostat. This ensures that heaters are automatically switched off after the maximum three hour setting – typical usage in a classroom situation. The overriding thermostat in the HM7B will cut power to the total system when the pre-set temperature is exceeded during operation on the economy element.

All the schools that have already installed the Pureheat Highmount are more than happy with their choice because the heaters have already proven their reliability and functionality in difficult applications. And they have the added advantage of supporting the Australian economy, as all Highmounts are proudly manufactured in Victoria.

The Highmount would also be ideal for use in caravan parks, student excursion camps, boarding schools and residential aged care.
